To draw symmetrically using both hands at the same time. Engage in Bilateral drawing.</p> <p>What I will need: paper, tape, two drawing implements that are the same and colour drawing materials.</p> <p>Home is where the art is</p> <p>Bi lateral drawing is a drawing process that involves both hemispheres of the brain simultaneously. Looking at the four videos I have provided you will see some approaches to this meditative style of drawing. Have a go at this yourself. You may find you do many before you get into a rhythm with it.</p> <p>If you cannot see the videos then simply fasten a piece of paper to a table and begin drawing circles with both hands at the same time and then depart into other lines and shapes and see where your two hands take you. So long as both hands are doing the same motion you will end up with a symmetrical bilateral drawing you can then colour in. 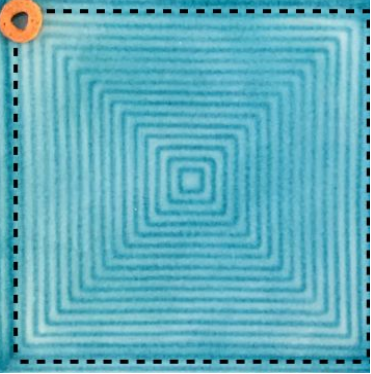
